

The Erasmus+ National Agency from Romania trusted us to set up an educational context which leads to elevating the civic competencies of young people while protecting their online safety.


SCOPE: Improve competencies in 10 digital domains, required within youth online activities


Youth learning styles

Youth equally appreciate exercises, real-world problems, case studies, discussions with peers as well as interactions with instructors and teachers.


