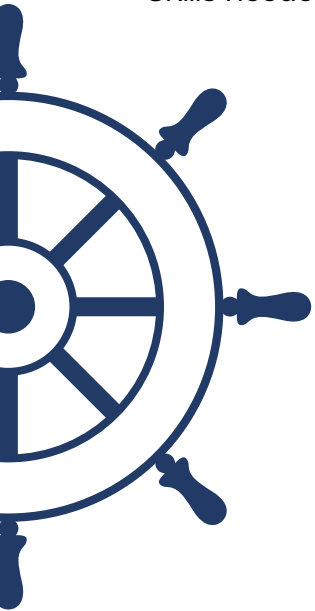

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S MARITIME DAY

On International Women's Maritime Day, we co-organised an event to highlight the role of women in this sector. This online conference discussed about "Employer's expectations of digital skills of maritime alumna". The event addressed the following topics:

- Digital skills needed in the maritime sector
- The role of responsible social media posts and the long-term personal development of youth
- Professional impact of women in the blue economy

BEING A MENTOR IN THE BLUE ECONOMY

This activity was organised in Spain to help young people to find a job in the Blue economy field. Because finding a job when you have just finished your studies can be challenging, it's important to guide them in the best way. We especially talked about:

- How to design them to work in the online environment
- What documents are needed
- Procedures in working in the online environment and best practices in e-mentoring.

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PROFESSIONAL FAIR

This event took place in Tulcea to present the Blue Careers and the opportunities to work in the Blue industry. The event's host, the Technological Highschool "Henri Coanda", emphasised the activities to facilitate the transition of young people towards the labour market. Several companies in the local blue economy joined the event with exhibition stands with employment opportunities. The best three stands were awarded applauses by participants: the most beautiful stand, the most valuable product of the project, and the best presenter of the activity.

CAPTAIN ON THE SHIP OF THE FUTURE

At the Maritime University in Constanta, students from different 7 high schools gathered to participate in simulator training activities. They participated in three activities that took place at the navigation simulator, the loading-unloading of liquid goods simulator and the electronic charts simulator. In the end, a competition was organized with questions related to the blue economy. The top three finishers were rewarded with "Captain on the Ship of the Future" diplomas and prizes consisting of AirPods awarded by Association TEAM4Excellence.

SKILLS NEEDED IN THE MARINA INDUSTRY

The project partners from Spain, Sea Teach, organized a conference with the Marina Transport Sector, including the Director General of the Marina Mercante Spain and representatives from the International Maritime Organisation. Sea Teach staff presented the BeBlue Erasmus+ project and its outstanding results.

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
